

268 College scholarships were given for 2022-23 academic year. 104 graduated in 2022 with degrees in: nursing, engineering, banking and accounting, computer technology, teaching and vocational training.

>3,000 children in 32 Homes received sponsorship and/or project funding

Ukrainian refugee relief – emergency supplies funded

Prevention of Child Trafficking Program in Telangana, India 2017-2023 – approximately 153,000 adults and children in 358 villages, and 40,700 school children in 249 schools were educated about child trafficking in India and how to prevent it. Over 250 trafficking victims were rescued.

Roof repairs, electrical repairs, and window screens to keep out bugs and snakes for Marian Girls' Home.

15 dining tables and benches for 80 children and hospital fees for Nambikkai Illam.

Electrical wiring for study hall, new roof for kitchen and dining hall with painting and new computer for Nithya Sahaya Matha.

Scooters for Athipet, St. Elizabeth's and Nirmala Matha homes.
