MACECALL HOME FOR CHILDREN IN KENYA

This home is a new partner with World's Children. They need a dining hall expansion with new kitchen for their 69 children. The dining hall can no longer fit all the children and they need new dining/study tables and seats. Cost: \$12,223

"For the kitchen project, we are planning to bring down the old timber structure that has now turned black due to smoke and old age. In its place we will construct a modern kitchen with work table, sink, kitchen cabinets and energy saver cookers." —Alfred Muthomi, administrator

Cost: \$10,334



KEEPING THE KIDS HEALTHY



CASA HOGAR IN MEXICO

In the photos above, you see one boy collecting eggs and another feeding their livestock. The eggs and milk and the vegetables they grow provide food for the children. Casa Hogar also sells farm fresh eggs and vegies to benefit their orphanage. They have asked us to help pay for animal feed for the cows, goats and pigs and to purchase more laying hens. They also need seeds and gardening supplies for their vegetable garden. Sustainability is the goal which is also good vocational training for the kids. Cost: \$1,023

In addition, Casa Hogar needs new sinks and plumbing in the kitchen. This will provide the children and staff with safe drinking water that meets government code.

They also need screens for the orphanage windows and doors because every year mosquitoes spread dengue fever in this region of Mexico. This will protect the kids so they can stay healthy and go to school.

The government is mandating that Casa Hogar fumigate for pest control, but Casa Hogar doesn't have the funds to pay for this necessity. The cost for these three home improvement projects: \$4,000

MAB'S HAVEN AND FATIMA HOME — PRESERVING THEIR FOOD

Both Mab's Haven in Zambia and Fatima Home in India need refrigerators to cut down on food waste. This will allow them to preserve nutritious food staples and produce to boost the health of their girls. Cost: \$600/fridge.
