UKRAINE REFUGEE UPDATE

The photos pictured show children from two Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camps in Ukraine. Four families live in the first camp with children who have special medical needs. They live in a wing of a regional hospital which was converted by volunteers. A second group of 35 children and their four teachers who evacuated from Eastern Ukraine are staying in a boarding house with three rooms.

Thanks to your generous donations, we were able to send \$13,000 which paid for tablets for learning, chargers, diapers, a vacuum cleaner, washing machine, cleaning supplies, hygiene products, cooking equipment, and medicine. They have additional needs for medical supplies and ongoing food support.

Thank you for helping improve the lives of all children and protecting them from war. We can do so much good when we work together.

2023 ANNUAL CAMPAIGN SPECIAL PROJECTS FUNDED

Thank you for giving to our 2023 annual campaign. Because of your generosity, we were able to fund 21 projects.

- Acts of Mercy Toilets, borewell with water filtration system, and new sealant on their cement water container. (\$7,254)
- Fatima Desks and benches for 47 girls to have a place to study, a refrigerator to store leftovers, and the rebuilding of their compound wall to keep the girls safe. (\$3,116)
- Happy Home An extended compound wall to protect the children. (\$2,987)
- Annai Scholastica Solar lighting in the outdoor bathrooms so the children don't step on scorpions or snakes when using the toilets at night. (\$5,176)
- Pandravedu Lighting in the study areas and a fan to keep mosquitoes off the children while also keeping them cool and a water filtration system. (\$2.594)
- Anna Vitiello Fresh paint for the interior and exterior of the home. (\$4,187)
- Casa Hogar Mosquito netting for beds, pest control fumigation services, plumbing for kitchen, and sustainable food security for the children. (\$8,667)
- Mab's Haven A full-size refrigerator, bunk beds, a larger dining table, and a parcel of land to build a permanent home to accommodate their growing family of girls. (\$6,854)
- Macecall Children's Home Construction of a new dining hall and kitchen. (Matching project: \$21,274)
- St. Michael's Elementary School Security cameras to keep the children safe in school. (\$867)
- Bridge of Hope New furniture to better meet the children's needs. (\$9,000)
- Balavikasita Six generators to keep the lights on at night during power outages so the children can study, fresh paint for the boys' and girls' homes interior and exterior, and small appliances and utensils in the kitchens at both homes. (\$15.891)
- Ukraine \$5,334 for refugee aid and \$1,600 for foster family needs. (\$6934)
