

PROJECTS FUNDED



Annual Campaign

India

Bethel Children's Home - Painting the outside of the boys and girls home. Fixing walls, windows and doors.

Lucile Colony - Monkeys were destroying their solar tubes. We funded a monkey grill over the tubes and replacement tubes.

Nambikkai Illam - After covid the public transportation had become unreliable. We funded a two-wheeler to help administrators to deliver groceries and get children to medical appointments.

Happy Home- The children were sleeping on the floor. We funded 40 cots for the girls dormitory.

Balavikasitha - Due to power scarcity, they were studying by candlelight. We funded 6 generators and new kitchen appliances. We also helped them paint the interior and exterior of their buildings.

Athipet Tribal Girls Home - The cupboards where they store their personal items needed doors to keep insects and snakes out of their things. We funded doors for all of their cupboards.

Anna Vitiello - We funded new cots, mattresses and a refrigerator.

Pandravedu - Security has become an issue at this home. We funded CCTV cameras and a projector

MORE PROJECTS FUNDED



Africa

Ethiopia - Bridge of Hope desperately needed new furniture. The current furniture and kitchen items have been used by 45 children for the last 15 years. We funded new furniture and kitchen supplies.

Kenya - Acts of Mercy needed toilets for clean hygiene for the children. We supplied funds for 3 double pit latrines and 3 more latrines for children with special needs. We also funded repair of their concrete water tank as well as a borewell and reverse osmosis filtration system so they could have safe drinking water.

Zambia - Mab's Haven needed bunk beds for the girls and a dining room table. We also funded a computer, printer and router so that they could communicate and do schoolwork.

Mexico

Mulege - Casa Hogar was struggling to have enough funds to feed the children. We provided monthly food security for groceries. We also funded septic tank repairs.
